We have just received a delinquent report on the above named Japanese for failure to report for induction on September 26, 1944.

Before issuing a complaint in this case I wish to have the case investigated and have this man interviewed with reference to his reason for not reporting for induction. I wish to know whether he was ill or what was the cause of his not reporting. I presume that he had previously reported for his preinduction physical.

When you are at Heart Mountain I desire that you interview this man. A copy of this letter is being sent to Local Board 1, Powell, Wyoming, and to Mr. Guy Robertson, Project Director, Heart Mountain, Wyoming.

I contacted George Minoru Horino, who was scheduled to leave Heart Mountain at 8:30 A.M. this date for induction, at the flag pole at the induction ceremony at 8:10 A.M. and he stated that he was not reported for his induction as ordered.

He stated that he felt his principles in this matter prohibited him from reporting for induction from a relocation center. He further stated that he realized that the consequences might be very severe, that the government would look at it in only one way, that was his refusing to appear for induction, but he felt morally obligated not to report.

Dear Mr. Sackett:

On July 18, 1944, George Minoru Horino, 6-24-E, Heart Mountain Relocation Center, was ordered to report for induction through Local Board #1, Powell, Wyoming, but he failed to do so.

George Minoru Horino is registered with Local Board #228, 5106 Fountain Avenue, Los Angeles 27, California. His order number is T-10438. He received a classification card from this Local Board dated February 3, 1944, placing him in 1A. This classification card is signed by Vance H. Finley of the above local board. The following wording on his classification card has been scratched out: "If you are the first person to take an appeal and such an appeal is based on occupational grounds you may, in accordance with Selective Service regulations, request transfer of the case to the board of appeals having jurisdiction over the area where you work."

About the middle of February Mr. Horino left Heart Mountain and went to Hardin, Montana where he had arranged to rent, on a share-crop basis, three hundred and twenty acres of land. One hundred and twenty acres were later planted to sugar beets and two hundred acres to grain. Horino had associated with him in this land rental proposition, his brother Tadashi.

Shortly after arriving in Hardin, Montana and making his arrangements for farming, Mr. Horino made an appeal to his local board for occupational deferment. This appeal was made through the Hardin Board #1 to his Los Angeles Board as above indicated. He states that he has never received a reply to this appeal. He sent another appeal through the Crop Production Association whose offices are in Hardin, Montana and he states that he has never had an answer to this appeal.

He was called for preinduction physical examination through the Hardin Board and appeared at Butte, Montana, April 7, 1944. He passed his physical examination and later received a certificate of physical fitness for the Army. Later, sometime in the month of May, he returned to the Heart Mountain Relocation Center, awaiting action on his appeals.

In the meantime, his brother Tadashi, who was associated with him in the arrangement for operating the farm near Hardin, was inducted into the Army on June 23, 1944. Mr. Horino has three brothers in the service; Sergeant Kiyoshi Horino, located at McClellan Field, Alabama, Corporal Joe

Horino, Camp Shelby, Mississippi, and Tadashi who is on enlisted reserve and is at present at Heart Mountain.

The thing which seems to influence Mr. Horino's thinking regarding his responsibility to Selective Service is the fact that there were four brothers who were eligible for call to the service. They worked out a plan between them whereby the last one left at home would attempt to relocate the family and start building up a home where the others could return after discharge from the Army. Horino feels that he has not been fairly treated due to the fact that his petitions for deferment, in most cases, have not been acted upon and that he was trying to carry out this plan for the benefit of his family, his three brothers in the service, and himself.

Horino states that in May he sent another petition to his local board and this time he received a reply which stated in effect that they had no jurisdiction to consider his petition for deferment. An order for induction into the Army was sent by the Los Angeles Local Board, as above referred to, to Idaho Falls where Horino had been located for a short time in the fall of 1943. That order for induction was finally forwarded to Heart Mountain and he received the same on June 14. Under this order he should have reported to Los Angeles on June 12th. He came into our office on June 14th and we sent Local Board #228, 5106 Fountain Avenue, Los Angeles 27, California, the following wire:

"George Minoru Horino, order number 10438, residing 6-24-E, this Center, today received order report induction Los Angeles June 12. Since Japanese-Americans cannot return Western Defense area desires transfer for delivery Local Board 1, Powell, Wyoming."

On June 23, 1944, Horino came into our office and presented an order he had received from Local Board #1, Hardin, Montana, for induction into the Army through that Board. According to this notice he was to have reported June 20. The order did not reach him until June 22. He came into the office immediately the following morning. We wired the Local Board at Hardin as follows:

"George Minoru Horino, order number 10,438, ordered induction June 20, returned this Center prior receipt of orders. Now residing 6-24-E. Desires transfer Local Board #1, Powell, Wyoming."

The Hardin Board, in place of referring these papers back to Local Board #228, Los Angeles, sent them directly to Local Board #1, Powell, Wyoming. Later Powell issued an order for his induction requesting that he report to the Powell Board on July 18th, which he failed to do. Horino states that he has at all times advised his draft board as to change of address.

Due to the fact that there are, according to statements made by Horino, several unanswered appeals, that his original order for induction asked him to report to Local Board #228, Los Angeles, California, a thing which he was prohibited from doing by the Exclusion Order effecting the Western Defense Area. and for the further reason that correct procedures were not followed in the

transfer of his papers from Hardin to Powell, it would appear that this entire case needs reconsideration and clarification. It is our understanding that Local Board #1, Powell, Wyoming, is referring these papers back to Local Board #228, Los Angeles, and in the event a new induction order is issued the papers will be referred by Local Board #228, through the California State Headquarters for Selective Service, who will in turn forward them to the Wyoming State Headquarters for Selective Service, who will refer the papers to Local Board #1, Powell, Wyoming.

We thought you should have all of this information before any action is started on this case.
