


DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE  
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The War Relocation Authority is engaged in a program of relocation. Persons who have left centers on indefinite or terminal leave (as is the case of all persons who have left to serve penal sentences of six months or more) are not eligible for readmission to a center as residents. We plan on closing relocation centers on or before January 1946, and readmission of persons who have left centers would complicate our closing program.

With respect to the question of parole, our only suggestion is that these cases be handled in exactly the same manner as any other Selective Service violation case.

Information concerning classification of these individuals by the Western Defense Command may be secured by writing to the Commanding General, Western Defense Command, The Presidio, San Francisco, California.

The above named subject is now serving a three year sentence in this institution for Violation of the Selective Service Act.

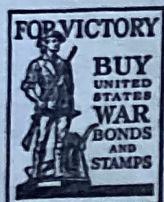
He is eligible for parole consideration on June 25, 1945, and will be heard by the United States Board of Parole at its next meeting at this institution sometime during the month of June 1945. This subject states that his plan for the future, in the event of his parole, is to work in Colorado or in Utah as a general farm laborer or if possible work in cabinet making, and also to help my parents to relocate.

The Board of Parole solicits your comments relative to the parole of this evacuee, together with any other information you may care to submit. Any comments that you can make as to the nature of his offense, the apparent motives behind it, and the manner in which it was committed, together with information as to his integrity and reliability will be appreciated, and will be of value to the Board in reaching a decision. In addition, the Board will appreciate an expression of opinion of the advisability of granting or denying parole in this case; whether or not this man would be acceptable to you for return to one of your relocation centers; whether or not there are any areas in the United States, where the War Department would refuse admission to this man. Your cooperation and assistance will be very helpful.

An early reply will be appreciated.
